



Use the following thoughts and questions to have one spiritual conversation. You can pick and choose, use them all or just allow the statement to be your guide. The emphasis shouldn't be about having all the answers, but simply having a conversation.

1. Opening Statement

Begin your conversation by asking about this statement:

One day everyone will see that the Lamb of God is worthy of all worship, cleanses us by His blood, and grants us access to His city.

This statement is the biblical truth the student's study was built around. Each week there will be one statement that ties the whole study together. These would be great statements to remember together. The hope is that thoughts and ideas will stem from these statements. You can also begin by sharing a thought of your own that you learned during your study of the same lesson. Ask what thoughts were surprising as the study was taught.

2. Thought From the Study

The worship of God around His throne is not impeded by the madness of the sin-marred world. God has been in control throughout history. Whatever may appear chaotic and disorderly upon the earth is actually guided by the Lamb who is worthy of praise and glory as God. This is the central theme of the Scriptures. God is gathering people from all nations, tribes, and tongues to be the beneficiaries of His Son's redemptive and atoning work. This is the foundation of our hope. The Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world will establish a Kingdom without end, and all who believe are certain to receive the blessings that have been promised by our loving Heavenly Father.

Why is it important to live life in the present with a view towards the future return of Christ?

3. Quote for Discussion

Discuss this quote together. How does this change your understanding of a relationship with Jesus?

4. Conversation Questions

Use these questions to begin thinking through and applying the lessons to your family life:

3. How does worship shape our family's ability to know God?
4. How does our vision of the future kingdom motivate our family to live on mission for God?
